	Southend has an incredibly varied communities.		
	Discussion had on HWS approach to raise our		
	own awareness. Our approach is to reach		
	various community groups which is useful.		
	Southend has such a diverse community, we

	CG, OR and TC attended a 'Head Space' meeting		
	which was a network event with loads of		
	attendees discussing how to work on reaching		
	out to BAME groups and engage them. The		
	event was organised by SAVS, Southend Council and the CCG where OR was apart of the initial		
	call.		
	Discussed HWS approach and what		
	meetings/events we can tap into and contribute		
	to and help organise.		
	OR acknowledges Mr Ali's questions which were		
	raised on this topic. OR has forwarded the		
	questions and comments to the Director of		
	Public Health, Krishna Ramkhewalon who is best		
	placed to answer these questions. When a		
	response has been received, this will be forwarded to Mr Ali.		
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6.	Mid and South Essex Health and Care		
	Partnership		
	Currently there are some big changes happening		
	at the moment which OR has alluded us to what		

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is happening and most if not all is about working	
in partnership with everyone else i.e Southend	
Council, CCG all at local level.	
CG is a Partnership Board member as part of the	
Service User Advisory Group. We had had	
representations from the hospitals in various	
areas and being able to submit comments which	
hopefully OR will be able to take forward.	
As far as the CCG goes, instead of there being 5	
Accountable Officers for the 5 CCGs, there will	
be 1 Accountable Officer who will oversee the	
budget for a Mid and South Essex CCG. They will	
also be the Executive Officer for the Partnership	
Group.	
Job post has been advertised with a hope the	
position will be filled next month.	
position will be filled flext month.	
The CCC is developing Primary Care Networks	
The CCG is developing Primary Care Networks	
(PCNs) – groups of GPs who have merged	
together and are recruiting a number of workers	
to take pressure from the hospital and enhance	
the service available at GP level. Southend has 5	
PCNs.	
At one of the local Surgery patient groups, one	
of the CCG staff came along to talk about how it	
is being organised. They are looking at patient	
representation into the PCNs.	
Patient Participation Groups will need to	
network to put views of surgeries forwards.	
In the PCNs there will be Social Prescribers –	
identifying those people who don't necessarily	
need medical services and putting them in touch	
with the voluntary and community services and	
service run by the council.	
LIM/C has an important role to answer all these	
HWS has an important role to ensure all these	
levels join up

	26 GP Practices	
	JB - How many of them are having functioning PPGs?

	Further questions from Mr Ali, responded directly to him before circulation to the attendees and public.	
	Has any GP practice asked for HWS support to assist in the recruitment of patients for PPG?	
	Yes, however this is the responsibility of the CCG.	
	Has HWS attended the meetings of the active PPGs and collected or had a look at the minutes of their sessions?	
	Yes, we have attended some PPG Meetings and two of our Advisory Board Members are Chairperson's of PPG's locally.	
	Has HWS taken the initiative at any time to offer to support a GP practice to have a functioning PPG?	
	Yes, we have actively encouraged residents to join their PPG through events, literature, drop-in sessions, social media and group presentations.	
	You are providing advocacy though it's not expected to be your responsibility. Is the Council giving you extra funding for that?	

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Yes. We benefit from working closely with the Advocacy Service	
Southend CCG and CP&R CCG have been working together ♥ almost like one CCG. Do	
HWS have a view on that?	
It does allow better use to be made of the CCGs running cost allowances and a stronger focus on commissioning from Southend Hospital. As part of the working across Mid & South Essex, we will soon have one CCG for the whole area. What is important is that the differing needs of each CCGs populations are addressed adequately.

Why are children with SEND experiences so many difficulties in Southend:-	
Has anything been done with CCG Southend regarding the opening the center?	
There was a 18 month to 2 year wait for ASD diagnosis before covid, how has this impacting the wait list time now.	
No information has been given to parents either waiting for an appointment or waiting to get put on the ASD pathway from the Lighthouse.	
Why are parents not being listened too regarding difficulties they are experiencing with kids suspected on the spectrum and Lighthouse	
paed's are only taking the word from schools and not taking into account these children mask. have piles of dossiers from parents in Southend that have been ignored.	
Why is there no specialist mental health provision in Southend for SEND children.	
In my opinion Emwhs are not fit for purpose. I also have many piles of dossiers from parents that have either not been able to access the	
service, have been told it's attachment, are only offered group therapy ( 6 sessions maximum) or	
emwhs safeguard to social services to get rid. (I also have evidence of this) Why does the Southend LA have unlawful and discriminative criteria for the Children with	
disability team? Cutting out ASD and ADHD.	

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	Why are children with SEND who are house bound, suffering with mental health and school refuse are denied any connection.
